Bluegrass From Brooklyn, Live In The Bronx! **The Birdhive Boys to Play at Bartow-Pell *First Friday!***

Bronx, NY, October 28, 2012 — On Friday the 1st of November, Bartow-Pell will present bluegrass by The Birdhive Boys from 6:00 to 8:00pm. The Birdhive Boys have been compared to Bill Monroe's Bluegrass Boys and neo-traditionalists the Johnson Mountain Boys. During their two-year long residency at the National Underground in Manhattan's Lower East Side, the Boys have had the privilege of sharing the stage with many fine acts, including national touring act The Holy Ghost Tent Revival, Grammy winners Dailey and Vincent, and New York City bluegrass heavyweights Michael Daves, Chris Thile, and Steve Martin. They've recently appeared with bluegrass super groups Michael Cleveland & Flamekeeper and Dailey & Vincent and have finished a new EP set for release this November.

The Museum will be open from 5:30 to 8:30 p.m. Listen to the Birdhive Boys pick and sing, partake of the refreshments, and celebrate fall with a stroll through the gardens and a ride on the Bronx Seaside Trolley.

The Bronx Seaside Trolley (free of charge) makes a continuous loop from the Bx29 bus stop at Pelham Bay Park (last stop on the #6 train) to the Bartow-Pell Mansion Museum and to City Island. The trolley runs from 5:25 to 10:30 p.m. The last pick up at Bartow-Pell is at 8:40 p.m.

Bartow-Pell Mansion Museum is located at 895 Shore Road, Pelham Bay Park, Bronx, New York. To reach us by public transportation, take the #6 Lexington Avenue Local subway to Pelham Bay Park station, followed by the Westchester Bee-Line #45 bus direct to the mansion gate. The mansion and carriage house are open to the public for guided tours on Wednesday, Saturday, and Sunday from noon to 4 p.m. The gardens and grounds are open daily from 8:30 a.m. to dusk. Mansion admission is \$5 adults, \$3 seniors and students; free for children under six. Visiting the garden and grounds is free.
